What is HeadSpace?

HeadSpace is a safe space in a library or youth centre designed by and for young people aged 11 to 19 that offers them somewhere to meet friends, share their reading, find information or take part in activities. It's a project from The Reading Agency who manage and develop it with libraries and young people.

What difference can HeadSpace make?

If you are refurbishing or building a new library space then you can use HeadSpace to involve young people in designing areas for them to read, listen, surf and chill. HeadSpace can support you to:

- involve young people in making decisions and shaping services
- demonstrate that you are meeting key local and national government requirements to provide positive activities and safe local spaces for young people
- provide volunteering opportunities for young people that can be accredited
- implement a strong brand understood and developed by young people
- develop staff skills in working with young people
- draw in strategic partners from the youth sector
- understand and meet the needs of socially excluded young people

We are already running HeadSpace with 20 local authorities, who report outcomes including:

- more socially excluded young people joining and actively using their library
- fewer behaviour issues in libraries by young people
- more young people volunteering in their community

Young people that are working with HeadSpace have also told us that they feel more self confident, participate in more positive activities as a result of their involvement and want to continue to be involved with the library service.

“Because of HeadSpace we are also involved with the Bolton Children’s Book Awards. There’ve been lots of exciting opportunities like that. We’ve even made a presentation about HeadSpace to a conference of 200 people.” Sameeta Patel, young volunteer at HeadSpace Bolton

How can you develop HeadSpace?

If you are interested in developing one or more HeadSpace sites in your authority you can purchase HeadSpace as part of our new Participate programme. HeadSpace can be purchased on its own or with the other Participate modules, Involving young people and Creative reading, which will support core staff skills development. The creative reading module also incorporates a subscription to our new social reading website for young people, groupthing.org. Libraries running HeadSpace who are subscribed to groupthing.org will be able to create HeadSpace web pages as way of getting young people reading and engaged in creative word-based activities.

What does HeadSpace include?

A three-year single HeadSpace site licence gives you access to all the support, resources and tools that you will need to build your HeadSpace project covering:
