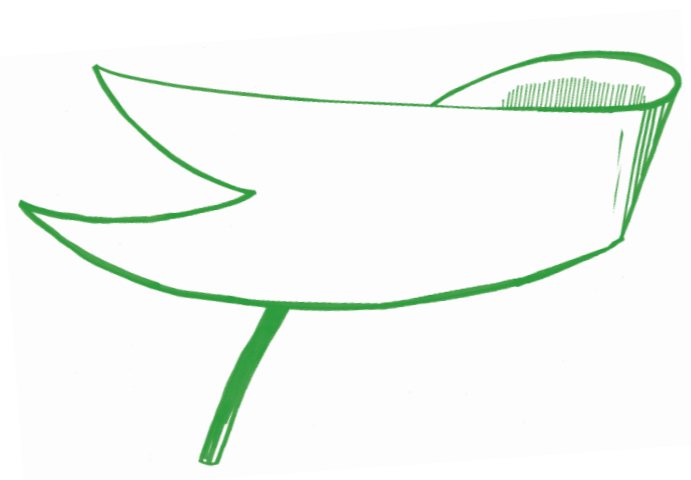


Entry and eligibility criteria

- Closing date is Monday 27 July 2009
- All entries must be signed and dated
- The organisers will not be responsible for the loss of or damage to any entries
- Entries will not be returned
- All entrants should be UK residents in full-time education and between 11 and 16 years of age
- All winners will be notified by phone or email during the week commencing Monday 31 August 2009
- No cash alternative to the prize will be offered
- Proof of postage will not be taken as proof of entry
- Entries must be written in English
- Joint entries will not be eligible
- Entries that exceed the maximum word count will not be judged
- The judges' decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into
- Organisers reserve the right to inform the media of all results and winners agree to take part in publicity
- All agreed travel expenses will be paid for by the organisers
- You must be accompanied to the Final Judging Meeting and the Award Ceremony by a parent or guardian
